Local Landmark Celebrates 70th Anniversary

Here's a Seattle trivia question: What year did fast food appear in Seattle and where was it? Answer - and so far no one has disputed it: The year was 1935 and the eatery has remained at the same location for 70 years in West Seattle at 2666 Alki Ave. Southwest. It was an establishment called The SPUD. The name has changed a little, but 70 years later Spud Fish and Chips on Alki in West Seattle is still serving its fast food fare and will celebrate its founding from Wednesday, Sept. 14 through November 13 -Seattle Founder's Day, when the Denny party first landed on Alki and Seattle was born. The Alki Spud Fish and Chips will open early on the 14th at 10 a.m. rather than the usual 11 a.m. opening, and will stay open that day until 10 p.m., one hour later than normal. A one-piece fish and chips special will be served for just 70 cents all day long that day only. KJR FM 95.7 Rock 'n' Roll's Greatest Hits will broadcast live from the restaurant from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and Mayor Greg Nickels - a West Seattle resident himself - will offer a proclamation. Local dignitaries will perform a small ceremony in honor of the anniversary. A limited edition T-shirt shrink wrapped into the shape of The Alki Spud's symbol of a bicycle will be distributed to the first 70 guests. Starting Thursday, Sept. 15 through Nov. 13, Alki Spud will offer a special Anniversary Combo Meal with a limited anniversary cup for \$6.99 with one-piece fish with chips and a cup of chowder.

The courtyard of the Log House Museum was decorated with red, white and blue tablecloths and American flags for our annual Membership Picnic on July 4th. Both new and long time members




