Celebrate Founders' Day at the Log House Museum

On Sunday, November 13 the Log House Museum will hold a celebration in honor of Founders' Day, with activities and entertainment. Founders's Day recalls the day in 1851 when the first white settlers landed on Alki Beach and established the settlement that eventually became the city of Seattle. The museum will welcome members of the Descendants Committee of Seattle who will be dressed in period costumes and will share stories of their ancestors' pioneer experiences. Children who attend are also encouraged to dress up in 19th century style if they wish. The Descendants Committee plans to provide visiting children with some historical trivia questions that can be answered by quizzing committee members. The answer to each question can only be gotten by asking the right person. This "historical scavenger hunt" will provide a fun and educational activity for the kids. We are also honored to welcome *Singing Feet*, a group of traditional Duwamish dancers and drummers, who will perform after the opening remarks and introductions at 2pm. Their participation acknowledges the critical help given to the pioneers by the Duwamish Tribe, without which the settlers might not have survived.

Other entertainment will include the Market Street Singers, who will perform at 3pm. The Duwamish Tribe will also provide traditional Indian Fry Bread and apple cider. Items relating to the pioneers and the Duwamish will be on display in the gallery, and videos relating to that historical period will be playing in our video room. Anyone who is interested in this important day in Seattle's history should plan to come down and enjoy the festivities. The museum will be open two extra hours on the day of the celebration, from 11 am until 4 pm.


Annual Membership Meeting to be Held at The Alki Homestead Restaurant

Composite Photograph of Lafayette Elementary, 1949. SWSHS Accession 2005.020

Built in 1893 and added onto in 1908, the Admiral district's Lafayette Elementary School, known previously as West Seattle Central School and simply "the castle," was damaged beyond repair in the massive 1949 Seattle earthquake. No one was hurt in the temblor because it occurred during spring vacation. Longtime West Seattle resident Kay McBride, now a resident of the Admiral district's Park West Care Center, shot the two photographs that make up this composite view of the damaged school building, as seen from across California Avenue. The "Lafayette Elementary School" sign can be seen at right. If you have original photographs of West Seattle, White Center and the whole of the Duwamish Peninsula, or know someone who does, please do your best to get them into the hands of our historical society so that they can be properly preserved and made available for the enjoyment and research of generations to come.


